THE LITTLEST BOHO has been accepted into the Official Selection of the 24th Raindance Film Festival.

NEW WEB SERIES' COMIC TAKE ON ANXIOUS PARENTS APPLYING FOR SCHOOL

Premiering at Raindance Film Festival 2016, North London-based original comedy, **The Littlest Boho**, by writers Cara Jennings and Sophie Trott's first episode goes live. An ensemble cast fronted by the writers, features Comedy Store Players Richard Vranch and Niall Ashdown, alongside writer Sophie's real-life partner, musician Dorian Ford and their 4 year-old daughter.

Cara and Sophie say: "We wanted to write about the miscommunication that happens between friends when some of them start having children and others don't. And the madness people seem to undergo when they have to apply for schools for their kids – the extreme, and often dirty lengths they'll go to."

Funnier than Mumsnet, and with stylistic similarities to Curb Your Enthusiasm and Transparent, **The Littlest Boho** follows friends Ruby (Sophie Trott) and Sinead (Cara Jennings), losers in a winners world, as they try to get Ruby's daughter a place at the local primary school. Produced/Directed by Sean Grundy, and Executive Produced by Jago Lee, the project's style could be described as heightened reality with elements of the surreal – there's a recurring cameo of Karl Marx (played by Jonathan Bidgood) seen only by Ruby, and a handful of contemporary local characters: Sally McNabb (Ruth D'Silva) the lactivist yoga teacher; Petra (Ruth Gibson), a ruthless banker's wife; an overworked teacher (Susie Emmett); and a smug, Ofsted winning head teacher (Anna Maria Nabirye). The series was filmed on location in Camden, London.

Director Sean says: "I was drawn to it because it's very funny but it also had something to say. Quite rare in comedy and sitcom today - it had targets squarely in it's cross-hairs: the current malaise of modern life in the murky, atomized, 'organic, fairtrade-only' middle-class pond of pushy mums, banker-husbands and offspring-as-accessories."
